Throughout LCPC's long history, our congregation has been mission-minded. We offer a wide variety of hands-on service opportunities; some focus on local issues and needs, while others extend our reach far beyond our community. Here are some ideas for how YOU can partner with us to build God's Kingdom here on earth...

1. LOCAL OPPORTUNITIES TO SUPPORT AT-RISK KIDS AND FAMILIES

Mentor a child, or become a prayer partner

<u>Kids Hope USA</u> is a national organization that was founded to address the needs of elementary age children who could benefit from a consistent, one-on-one mentoring relationship with a caring adult. This program is based on a model of "one church, one school, one child, one hour a week". LCPC mentors meet at La Crescenta Elementary School with their assigned students for one hour weekly during

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the school year. Each mentor is paired with a prayer partner who covers the student, mentor, and whole program in prayer.

Many of our mentor/mentee relationships continue for the full six years of the student's elementary education. Research shows that when kids feel loved and valued, they are better able to learn, grow and succeed; our goal is to help kids see that they have a future and a hope, keeping in step with God's promises in Jeremiah 29:11.

Kids Hope co-directors Armineh Manookian and Janie Roach are always seeking new



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mentors, prayer partners, substitute mentors, and hospitality helpers. Walking alongside a child during the most formative years of their life is a powerful way to serve the Lord. PASTOR'S LETTER

Greetings, La Crescenta Presbyterian Church Family & Friends. Happy New Year!

As we embark on a new year together, I love to have a focus that weaves us together throughout the year. This year, our focus is "To Know Christ and Make Him Known!" My focus Scripture passage is Philippians 3:10-11: "I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead."

Of all the ministry slogans I've heard over the years, my favorite is this one: "To Know Christ and Make Him Known!" The question is, do we really know Christ? And what does it mean to know Jesus? Personally, there's been a fresh hunger and renewed passion in my heart to know Jesus like never before, to fall in love with Him all over again. During this Fall, I re-read the four Gospels, 89 chapters, all so that I can know Christ Jesus more.

Living a life like Jesus must begin with being His student. This is the seed of discipleship. Contemporary Christians have mistakenly, I believe, set up a dichotomy between discipleship and evangelism. The heart of evangelism is about interacting with others like Jesus. He conversed

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unemployed, or under-employed by providing food and access to services that provide a pathway to more successful lives. The primary focus of this ministry is their weekly food pantry, which provides about 150 to 200 households with generous boxes of food every Saturday; on Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day, they also provide hot meals and encouragement to our unhoused neighbors at Sunland Park; and they sponsor a Family Christmas Celebration to bring joy to underprivileged children in the community.

Most people served by the weekly pantry do so through a drive-up service, lining up in their cars at Heart of the Canyons Church in Lakeview Terrace. In addition, deliveries are made to several locations with large unhoused populations, as well as to about 15 households who for one reason or another cannot get to the church. That's where LCPC comes in! Members and friends of the church deliver these boxes to households in the area each Saturday.

Two teams of two people typically deliver about eight boxes each, requiring less than an hour and a half of their time from leaving their home to their return. It's an easy task, made all the time with those who thought they were close to God and those who deemed themselves lost and without hope. Yet, He invited all to learn from Him – it's that simple. But often, we overcomplicate missional living and sharing the Gospel. Jesus not only told us to make disciples but also modeled how to. I believe most Christians have divorced the teachings of Jesus from the methods, and yet expect the same results.

I believe Christ's methods are just as divine as His teachings. He showed us that the fundamental methodology in making disciples is relationships grounded in truth and love. Our Lord is the greatest disciple-maker and evangelist in history, and His way works.

Paul said to the Colossians, "Him (Christ) we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ" Colossians 1:28. Notice Paul said, "I preach Christ," not "I preach about Christ." We don't just want to share true information about Christ; but present Him in the most compelling way we can so that they come to love Him, praise Him, trust Him and desire to know Him better. Preaching about Christ informs our minds, but preaching Christ brings Him closer to us so that we can grow in relationship

easier by the gratitude of the people we serve. To ensure we can meet this need each Saturday, we need a few more volunteers.

Provide a home-cooked meal to unhoused families

Since opening its doors in 2010 as part of the national Family Promise organization, <u>Home Again LA (HALA)</u> has assisted over 2,000 unhoused families in securing permanent housing. In 2023 alone (the most recent full year of data at time of this writing), HALA served 699 families through its various programs.

A core program for HALA is providing 90day shelter for situationally homeless families with children. First Presbyterian Church of Burbank provides the shelter, while HALA works with the family to secure a permanent housing solution. The success rate of this program is outstanding – after this 90-day period, nearly all families secure a stable and sustainable housing solution.

Volunteers from LCPC provide dinners (hot and ready to serve, between 6:00 and 6:30 pm) each night for one week during each calendar quarter (4X a year). Besides preparing with Him. "To Know Christ and Make Him Known" is my prayer for LCPC in 2025. We've to learn how to engage people in the everyday moments and simple ways before we can



enter the profound, life-giving implications. A friend of mine, who is a missionary in the Middle East, once gave a presentation on how to reach out to non-believers in 60 seconds. I remember him recommending four simple ways in our interactions with non-believers: (1) Be kind. (2) Be present. (3) Be brave. (4) Be like Jesus. As we embark on this journey together in 2025, my prayer is that Jesus will make Himself known first TO us and then THROUGH us.

3. MISSION OPPORTUNITIES BEYOND OUR COMMUNITY (BUT STILL WITHIN DRIVING DISTANCE!)

Help build a community hub / children's home in Rosarito, Baja Mexico... or minister to children and their families through community fellowship events and other opportunities throughout the year

The vision for <u>Casa de Los Angeles</u> (<u>CDLA</u>) was sparked back in 2008, when church member Lucia Iriks, inspired by the work that LCPC was doing to build houses and churches in Baja, offered to donate a parcel of land that she owned to a mission that would



further God's Kingdom in the area. That general idea blossomed into a formal decision by LCPC in late 2010 to support the building of an orphanage on her land. Over the next few years, other members of her family were inspired by LCPC's vision, and added their adjoining parcels to the mission.



Originally envisioned as an orphanage to house 38 children, the vision for this mission has expanded to meet the changing needs of the surrounding community of Lomas Altas. Completion of the main building is still likely a couple of years off (with fundraising being our primary constraint), but with the support of new, local partners, we are opening up a safe and welcoming space on-site so we can begin offering English classes and other essential services (100% volunteer-driven) to the community this month!

The Casa de Los Angeles site is situated on a breezy hillside with an expansive view of the

ocean and Rosarito's famous beaches. It can be reached from LA by car in less than 3 hours. CDLA plans to sponsor several multi-church, shortterm mission trips in 2025. Teams stay at a comfortable, secure mission station in a quiet neighborhood in Rosarito operated by missionary couple (and CDLA partners), Ron and Kristy Struska. Watch for details!


